### **Music Notes**

Earth and All Stars is one of several hymns written by Pastor Herbert Brokering (1926-2009), a Lutheran pastor who served the church in many ways and wrote over forty books as well as several hymns. The tune EARTH AND ALL STARS was composed by David N. Johnson (1922-1987), formerly music department chair at St. Olaf College and composer of many hymn tunes, hymn preludes, and harmonizations. He taught at several other colleges

and was organist at Syracuse University and Trinity Episcopal Church in Phoenix, and wrote guides for the teaching of organ.

How Great Thou Art has a complicated history. The initial hymn, O Store Gud (O Mighty God), was written in Swedish by Carl Boberg (1859-1940), a member of the Swedish Covenant Church who, in addition to serving in the Swedish Parliament, wrote many hymns and edited Covenant hymnals. It was set to the Swedish folk tune which now bears the same name (O STORE GUD. In 1931, Stuart K. Hine (1899-1989) and his wife, Plymouth Brethren missionaries, were evangelizing in the Carpathian Mountains in Ukraine when they heard it sung in Russian (itself a translation from German). Hine made the rather free translation we know today, adding a couple of verses of his own, and finally published it in 1949As sung by George Beverly Shea and Cliff Barrows, it was a highlight of Billy Graham's evangelical Crusades. It is said, on the basis of numerous surveys, to be either the first or second most popular hymn in both the United States and the United Kingdom.

That Cause Can Never Be Lost or Stayed was originally written in Danish by Kristian Østergaard (1855-1931), a Danish-American Lutheran pastor and author of hymns and novels. He served several churches in the United Evangelical Lutheran Church (the "holy Danes", but is buried in the cemetery in Tyler, Minnesota. J.C. Aaberg (1877-1920), another Danish-American Lutheran pastor in the "happy Danes" (American Evangelical Lutheran Church), translated many favorite Danish hymns into English. The tune ØSTERGAARD was composed by Jorgen Nellemann, about whom no information can be found.

Marty Haugen (1950-) has written many hymns and liturgical music, including both text and tune for *As the Grains of Wheat*. He has served churches from Roman Catholic to United Church of Christ and was composer-in-residence at Holden Village.

The sending hymn *Go, My Children, with My Blessing* was written by Jaroslav Vajda (1919-2008), the son of Slovak immigrants who was ordained as a Lutheran pastor in 1944. He served parishes, edited Lutheran periodicals, and worked at Concordia Publishing House in St. Louis; he wrote poetry, hymns, and carols throughout his life, and translated much Slovak literature. AR HYD Y NOS is familiar as the Welsh lullaby *All Through the Night*. A Welsh folk melody, it was first published in 1784 in *Musical and Poetical Relics of the Welsh Bards*.
