DO YOU CONSIDER WEST DENMARK A "THIRD PLACE"?

You might or might not have heard the term "Third Places" but it feels like West Denmark, because of its welcoming and hospitable traditions, is just such a place. Many of the articles in this month's newsletter talk about the ways that West Denmark serves the purpose of creating, providing and sustaining a third place in our community.

Third Places are a sociological term used to describe environments and places outside of work and home where people gather to interact, relax, foster social connections and build and sustain community. Third places regularly host or are the site for voluntary, informal and happily anticipated gatherings beyond the usual realms of home and work....think Family Camp, Heritage Council concerts, Aebleskiver, Harvest Fest, Sunday meditation and worship services, just to list a few. Being in a "Third Place" is good for us because they can provide us with a sense of belonging that would be hard to find without them...we feel welcome in them, and we can meet our neighbors in new ways and around shared interests.

When you read this month's newsletter, think of all the ways West Denmark is helping to build community and sustain you!!

Our Sacred Thread

As we find ourselves navigating a time of transition here at West Denmark Lutheran Church, it becomes essential to pause and reflect on who we are and where we are being called. Our congregation is blessed to hold dearly to the thread of N.F.S. Grundtvig's theology and philosophy., which remind us of the sacred nature of creation, music, culture, and the lived faith that translates into loving action. This foundation is our thread, tethering us to our beliefs amidst divisive times.

My husband and I are in the midst of consolidating our living to our lake home in St. Croix Falls. There are days I can feel unmoored.

That is why I am led back to the writer, theologian, and educator Parker Palmer. He beautifully articulates this necessity for discernment in his reflections on the threads that weave through our lives. I find myself resonating deeply with his insights, especially as we grapple with the dynamic shifts in our world. He encourages us to recognize that while our environments change, there exists a thread that remains constant, guiding us through the maze of life's complexities. William Stafford's poem, "The Way It Is," speaks this truth gently but powerfully:

There's a thread you follow. It goes among things that change. But it doesn't change.

As we consider our own institutional thread, it's a moment to grasp this symbolism fully. Yes, holding onto that thread may not promise an easier journey, but it will ensure that we do not lose ourselves in the shadows of uncertainty. Each of us knows what it is to wander through the dark woods of doubt and fear. Yet, with our thread firmly in hand, we can find our way back home and venture into those places that may challenge us. In moments of self-reflection, I often ponder the questions that Palmer suggests:

- What has given my life a sense of meaning and purpose?
- What darkness do I need to enter and explore?
- When do I typically lose my way, and how can I prepare myself to navigate these challenges?

These inquiries resonate deeply as we reflect collectively on our mission and identity as a congregation. It is a time that we can learn to lean on one another again as we embody our faith in connection.

I'm grateful for each of you during moments of feeling unmoored. Whether it be sharing reflective moments at the 8:30 meditation group, looking out over the congregation as I consecrate the bread and the wine, or share sacramental coffee after the service, I am reminded of my thread that weaves me into the web of connection.

CALLED TO SERVE?

A Request for Volunteers to Serve on the Pastoral Call Committee

Over the next few months, a selected group of volunteers from the West Denmark congregation will begin working with the Synod and the Church Council to screen and interview potential candidates to serve as a pastor for our church.

The Call and selection process will move ahead like this:

- ★ The Church Council calls for and appoints the members of the Call Committee.
- ★ The Synod will assist West Denmark in the process by advertising for and doing an initial screening of applicants.
- ★ The members of the Call Committee will review and interview potential candidates that have been provided by the Synod and make recommendations to the Church Council.
- ★ The Council will choose the applicant who appears to best meet the needs of our church and present the candidate and the recommendation to the voting members of the congregation.
- ★ If the congregation votes to agree with the Council and the Call Committee's recommendation, the Council will negotiate with the candidate and make a formal job offer.

The Council is seeking 5 to 7 persons to undertake this work. To date, there are two persons who have expressed an interest in participating.

NORDIC CHURCHES GRANT

The Final Report and Visit to the Hall

On October 21st Emily Sadjek, representing the Nordic Churches Grant Project, will visit West Denmark's Hall. The purpose of her visit is to tour the completed renewal work at the Hall that we were able to undertake with the financial assistance from this grant. By raising \$15,000 we became eligible to apply for and did receive a one-to-one matching grant from the foundation to undertake several improvements at the Hall.

Improvements include new flooring in the lower-level dining area, a new metal fire escape and metal outdoor handrailing and deconstruction and removal of the old wooden fire escape, two new fire doors and installation of new lighted exit signs, new main level ceiling, stage and downstairs lighting, and new paint in the lower level.

Our West Denmark Woodland School: Sturdy Roots, Mindful Growth

At the West Denmark Woodland School, our mission is to develop young children's love of and comfort in nature (sturdy roots) and to support their mindful growth in woodland settings. Many of the outdoor projects we undertake and the way we set up our indoor environments reflect this mission. You are welcome to visit our outdoor and indoor settings, where you will see much progress as we get close to opening our program. Please feel free to ask us questions and share comments.

This week, Liz Dodge will be submitting our Program Handbooks and Procedures Manual for review. Once approved, we will get a date for our licensing visit. This past month, we have continued work on our Nature Playscape, Woodland Trails, and indoor spaces in order to prepare for this visit. For example, Ronnie Petersen, Jeff Wetzig, Carl Hansen, and Carrie Petersen have been working on installation of a hill slide in our Nature Playscape. Once we've added more dirt, we'll seed the hill, lay down some wood chips in the landing area, and install "tree cookie" steps.

A simple log platform is being built for the drums in the Music/Sound area. Nicole LaLond and Mary Jensen put together a small shelter for the Sand Pit. We're anticipating delivery soon of a Mud Kitchen structure in the Gardening corner and boards and branches for the Loose Parts Area. Nicole and Mary cleaned up the Woodland Trails and Exploration Areas, and Norm Hansen took down a dead tree near the trail. Indoors, Carrie has been setting up the Art Studio room. Beth Petersen added some artistic flourishes. Nicole and Mary have been setting up the Kitchen Area as well as the Meeting, Manipulatives, Book Browsing, Block, and Science/Storage Areas. Liz has been organizing the Office Area. There's lots to see. So, come visit us and see what we've done!

In addition to preparing for our licensing visit, we have been gathering information from a dozen or so interested families. We have plans for additional recruitment and family tours as soon as we establish a date for our licensing visit.

Our Capital Campaign continues with Al Zook's 90th Birthday 100-Mile Fundraising Walk. He has raised thus far almost \$2,500 to support his walk! We hope to expand soon the geographic reach of this appeal to the Twin Cities area. We also have applied a local grant to support planned Family Events for the upcoming year.
