Worship and Music Notes

As we approach the end of the church year, today's readings point us to the hope of heaven, highlighted in our opening and closing hymns.

Jerusalem, My Happy Home is adapted from a manuscript dated 1593 held in the British Library, with the author listed only as "F.B.P." It is thought that F.B.P. was a Catholic priest and that the original 24 stanzas in Latin are based on the writings of St. Augustine. Numerous translators and adaptors have produced the version we sing today. The tune LAND OF REST is a North American folk tune published in *The Sacred Harp* as a shape-note tune in 1844.

Oh, Happy Day When We Shall Stand was written in Norwegian by Wilhelm Andreas Wexels (1797-1866), who was born in Copenhagen but spent much of his life in Christiania (now Oslo), Norway where he was a Lutheran minister preaching spiritual revival. The translation we sing is a composite of various versions over many years. Nikolaus Herman's (1480-1561) tune LOBT GOTT, IHR CHRISTEN is widely known in Germany as the tune for the Christmas hymn of the same name. Herman was a schoolmaster and church cantor in Joachimsthal, Bohemia (now Jáchymov, Czechia), who wrote and composed many hymns.

In Revelation 22:16, Jesus refers to Himself as "the bright morning star." This term has been used as a metaphor for Jesus Christ in many hymns, probably the best-known of which is Philipp Nicolai's (1556-1608) Wie Schon Leuchtet der Morgenstern (O Morning Star, How Fair and Bright). Nicolai was a Lutheran pastor who led an eventful life, frequently engaging in arguments with both Roman Catholics and Calvinists, and at one point in his life being forced to flee from invading Spanish troops. Although he published many polemical works in his lifetime, his legacy is the two beautiful hymns for which he wrote both words and music: the one we are singing today, and the Advent hymn, Wachet auf! Ruft uns die Stimme (Wake, Awake, for Night is Flying).

The choir anthem, *A Jubilant Song* by Mary Lynn Lightfoot (b. 1952), is based on Latin hymns and the Psalms.
